The first week at the New Mexico Legislature this time around was filled with new faces. There were thirty-five new legislators, along with their families and retinues that come along with being a new politician. They have migrated to Santa Fe all bright eyed and bushy tailed and ready to work while the old guard sits back and watches. It is going to be a very interesting Session.

In the Senate, the powers that be made a compromise behind closed doors that resulted in the unanimous election of Senator Mary Kay Papen, of Las Cruces to the President Pro Tempore's seat. This vote is just one example of the extreme professionalism in the Senate that has to be respected. In the House, a 38 to 32 party line vote resulted in Ken Martinez of Grants as the new Speaker.

There were bill introductions this week including a Hydraulic Fluids Disclosure bill introduced by House Energy Committee Chairman Brian Egolf. You will recall that last year, Chairman Egolf had a full hearing on this issue and vowed to bring the issue back this year. He did not disappoint. The full list of bills IPANM is tracking is below. Each entry includes a hyperlink to the most recent version of the bill; the official name of the legislation; the committee assignments and the sponsor. Once the bill crosses over to the second chamber, the new committee assignments and sponsor will be added. Every week I will update the information on the bill if there have been any amendments or substitutions to the bill. If the bill is tabled in committee, I will mark it in the Committee Assignments column. Note, however, that a bill may be revived any number of procedural motions by committee members.

Please put February 15th on your calendars as a reason to come to the Roundhouse. IPANM will be hosting our third Oil and Gas Day at the Capitol. The event, which will include displays, kids, color guards, speeches by politicians and Young Ambassadors alike, is set to be one of our best! The tax expenditures budget is one that will be fraught with mistakes since the TRD staff does not understand the nature of the Exemptions, Credits and Deductions the Oil and Gas industry receives. Two years ago, the TRD prepared a report claiming that if all 'loopholes' were closed against industry, the State would have hundreds of millions in additional yearly revenue. These falsehoods are the basis for this bill, however, the concept is supported by LFC leadership. The bill has previously been vetoed by both Richardson and Martinez.

A repeat from the last session; including elimination of discretionary opt out with approval from TRD; the bill last year passed the Senate (28-13) and the House (36-33) but was vetoed; This bill amends corporate income tax rates down and requires unitary corporations to file a combined return with their other unitary corporations as though the entire net income were that of one corporation in NM and then pays based on an apportionment formula; effective date 1/14; similar to SB 59

	Corp. Tax, Reporting, Single		
<u>SB 59</u>	Sales & Repeals	SCORC/SFC	Cisneros

This bill is identical to Wirth's SB 13 except that it adds provisions changing the formula for apportionment of business income from manufacturing; processing natural resources including hydrocarbons is specifically exempt from the manufacturing definition; repeals several tax credits including the rural jobs tax credit and the high wage jobs tax credit.

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
