





Federal Oil & Gas Relief

- 60-Day Temporary Shut-In Program (Discontinued) (BLM accepted temporary shut-Ins w/o demonstrating well economics because it was obvious...)
- Temporary Royalty Relief Program (Discontinued)
- IRS: Change to Marginal Well Production Tax Credit (Credit amount for tax years beginning in calendar year 2019 is \$0.08 per 1,000 cubic feet.)
- Net Operating Loss (NOL) Tax Relief
- 2019 Tax Payment Extensions



Federal Funding Relief

<u>C.A.R.E.S.</u>

- Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) (21,924 loans to New Mexico businesses = \$2.2 billion processed as of July 8th.) (\$132 billion remains in PPP funding with extension to August 8th.)
- Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) (9,650 have been distributed to New Mexico businesses for a total of \$566 million.)

The Trump Administration proposes updates to oil and gas regulations

Proposed changes ensure fair return for taxpayers and clarify regulations for producers

WASHINGTON – In support of President Donald J. Trump's <u>America-First Energy Strategy</u>, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) today announced proposed revisions to three key regulations governing oversight of oil and gas production and reporting. The proposed regulations are designed

State Oil & Gas Relief

- OCD: Under Economic Hardship Conditions, operators can apply for a blanket Agreed Compliance Order for up to a 36-month temporary shut-in extension.
- OCD: Acknowledges increased site inspections. Due to inspectors not performing any inspections that require other parties to be on site. UIC tests requiring an OCD inspector are currently suspended and will be rescheduled for a future date.
- OCD: Mailed NOVs that require 30-days to remedy can be extended to 90-days on case-by-case basis. Contact OCD as soon as you receive NOVs.
- IPANM asked members for feedback on production limits: 75% No 25% Yes





State Oil & Gas Relief

- **SLO:** Shut-in provisions for up to a year
- SLO: Oil and gas lessees seeking a special exception for an extension of an oil and gas lease shall directly contact the Assistant Commissioner of Minerals, Jordan Kessler, via email, at <u>jkessler@slo.state.nm.us</u>.
- **SLO:** Oil and gas lease sales continue, but many (if not all) require minimum bid.
- WARNING: SLO in-house review to justify raising \$25,000 blanket bond on remediation activities. (In response to failure of HM 29 in House during 2020 Session.)



Expected Natural Gas Price Increase Would Help San Juan Basin



Santa Fe New Mexican (June 8, 2020) – To say times are tough for energy companies in the San Juan Basin would be an understatement.

The market for natural gas is so bad right now that T. Greg Merrion (former IPANM Board President) has shut in nearly half of his family-owned company's wells, most located in northwestern New Mexico.

But that could soon change.

If Merrion and key industry analysts are correct, there might be a silver lining in the oil crash caused by the coronavirus pandemic — it could end up helping northwestern New Mexico natural gas producers and even give a lift to state revenue in a time of crisis.
